This project will go out to bid separately from U-5804.

The \$330,473 in STBG-DA funds targeted to Bicycle / Pedestrian projects remains unprogrammed because the two remaining projects from the 2017 call for projects had STBG-DA funding requests exceeding the available amount. a. Confirmed that the funds have been declined for both projects (Pleasant Plains Road Multi-Use Trail in Matthews and Potts Sloan Beatty Multi-Use Trail in Davidson) because the \$330,473 would not adequately address the current funding shortfalls for these projects.

NCDOT –Division 10 and Union County have requested that the POC consider recommending programming the \$629,000 in unobligated STBG-DA funds to the NC-200/Parkwood School Road roundabout in Union County, which has a \$1.8M cost estimate.		
		2. Project has been recently selected for \$1M in safety funding from NCDOT, and Union County approved increasing their local contribution to \$200,000.		
		3. The addition of the requested STBG-DA funds would make the project fully funded.a. Absent the allocation of \$629,866 in STBG-DA funds, the project will lose the Highway Safety funds and will not commence.
